One Small Problem

Before you begin, let me comment on your purchase of the *One Year Chronological Bible*. In the process of making this *Study Guide* available, I discovered a small problem. It seems that older versions of this Bible have a different reading schedule than newer versions. Let me explain.

Tyndale Publishing first printed the *One Year Chronological Bible* in 1995, and it was in the NIV translation. However, in 2000, Tyndale printed a second version in the *NLT Bible*. For some reason, they changed the daily reading schedule between these two prints.

My Study Guide is based on the 2000

NLT version, so if you use the 1995 version, you will notice a difference and probably be confused. Also, Tyndale has republished the *One Year Chronological Bible* in both the *NIV* and *NLT* translations in 2007 and 2013. The reading schedule for these updates is the same as the 2000 print, and, therefore, can be used with my *Study Guide*.

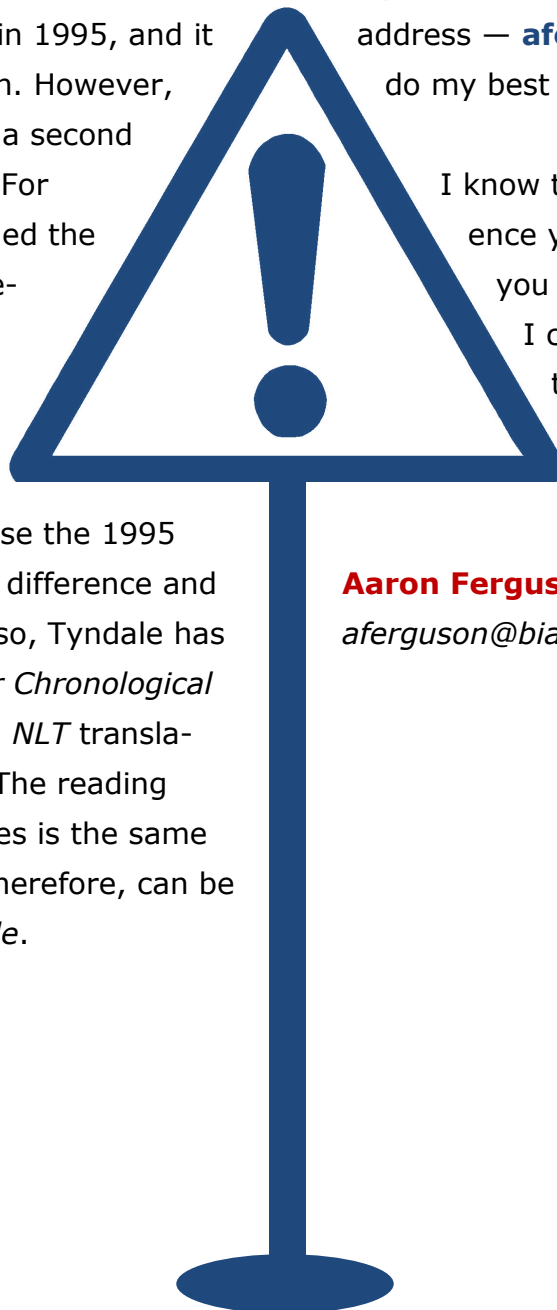
I apologize for this inconvenience, but I thought you would want to know as soon as possible. I am hoping to produce a *Study Guide* for the NIV in the future.
